Who is a Caregiver?

You are a caregiver if you do anything for anyone who can't do it for themselves, whether in your home, their home, full time, or just a few hours a week.

Few of us are trained caregivers, and often the need to provide care for another is sudden and unexpected. The National Family Caregiver Support Program helps families sustain their efforts to care for older adults with serious chronic illness or disabilities and for kinship caregivers.
